We bridge critical resource gaps for shelters in Toronto by turning unwanted gift cards into a charitable solution.


We elevate the voices of the homeless community; the better we understand homelessness, the better we will be equipped to end it.




# ReGiftcard Program

Fix the 6ix is the only organization in Toronto that turns unwanted and partially used gift cards into a charitable solution. Since its inception in 2016, more than \$9300 worth of gift cards have been used to bridge critical resource gaps for Toronto homeless shelters. Past donations from the ReGiftcard program have included the following:

- Purchasing Cineplex movie tickets for Eva's
   Place Homeless Youth Shelter
- Donating grocery, pharmacy and Starbucks gift cards to Kennedy House Youth Shelter
- Purchasing coats and wardrobe staples for clients of The Meeting Place
- Contributing books to the family library at Juliette's Place family shelter

Fix the 6ix collects gift cards by partnering with local businesses and workplaces to set up donation stations on premise.

Donation stations can be placed near POS counters, reception desks, and in break rooms at your workplace. They are an excellent way to rally your customers, clients and colleagues around a good cause. Our team will drop-off and pick up the donation station at your convenience.



### Humanize Homelessness

Our team of volunteers coordinate monthly outreach in Toronto to provide individuals who are homeless an opportunity to share their stories. Our team offers care packages including gift cards, snacks and essentials to every individual we meet. With the participants consent, they may choose to share their story with us.

We interview individuals experiencing homelessness to elevate their voices and destigmatize this community. Fix the 6ix aims to create a space where people with lived experience feel included, acknowledged and valued, while improving the public's understanding of homelessness and its complexities.

Since the program's inception, Fix the 6ix volunteers have shared the stories of over 90 individuals experiencing homelessness.
